Update to our rules on meeting our available Pomeranians.

We will rarely be meeting people at our home anymore. This is for mainly 2 reasons.

#1. Bio-Security: Recently we had someone visit to see a puppy and brought their current Pomeranian with them. Sadly they brought a little bacteria with them. While it didn't affect everyone and was easy to treat we are increasing our bio-security.

Biosecurity is a series of management practices designed to prevent the introduction, delivery, and spread of disease pathogens that can harm or adversely affect livestock, crops, environments, and people. These practices may also help eliminate or control diseases already existing on the premises.

#2. We have seen to many reports of people visiting breeders with ill intent. I know most people are not these people but we have determined that inviting unknown people into the privacy of our home in today's world is becoming more of a risk that we are willing to take.

How are we going to work around these concerns? We will be willing to meet you on a video call where you can meet the dog(s) you are interested in and if the parents are on site you can meet them on the video call as well. After that we will be willing to meet you in a public place that is out in the open that provides safety for us and the dog(s). I will often try to do this near dog shows which is where I spend a lot of my week-ends.

We will continue to offer to meet people at airports if they are from further away. As well as try to meet people within 2 hours of our home.

We are also willing to share photos of our home, grooming room, dog yard etc. so that you can see where we raise our Pomeranians. Our Pomeranians are raised in our home and in our general living areas, or underfoot as some say. We are in the country so normal neighbor noises are something that they are not used to, but they do know about all the house noises in the country/rural setting.
